Scripture: God's Law (Ex. 20) – Luke 5:17-32

Singing: 53:1-5 - 69:1 - 60:1-5 - 84:1-2 - 322:1-4

If you are sick, you need to go and be with Jesus!

I. Perhaps you don't know, but you are sick!

- A. Yet you are not *just* sick: Mark 7:20-23
 - 1. Don't let your feelings or others deceive you!
 - 2. Be honest with yourself and listen good to your conscience!
- B. Do you believe Jesus' teaching: You are sin-sick?

II. Yet the good tidings are that Jesus came for you who are sick

- A. Do you notice where Jesus was when He spoke His teaching in vs. 31-32?
 - 1. How did that happen? Why among 'them?'
 - 2. What is really amazing about Levi's idea? (vs. 30)
- B. Do you think Jesus would be willing to 'sit with you?'

III. Jesus tells you that His place is among the sick like you

- A. Do you notice what Luke wrote about Levi's former friends? (vs. 30)
- B. But your Lord Jesus is different than the scribes and Pharisees: vs. 31-32
 - 1. He tells you who are sick: I am your soul Doctor!
 - 2. He tells you who think you are good: I am no use for you if you think that!

IV. Therefore if you are sick you need to go and be where Jesus is

- A. Don't stay away till you are better: your sin is like cancer
- B. Don't work on being better: sin is never cured by what you do!
- C. Don't despair to turn to Him: Jesus came to call sinners to repentance

"All that the Father give me shall come to Me; and him that cometh to Me I will in no wise cast!" John 6:37

1. Many children never come to church to hear about God. What could you do to help them hear about God?

- 2. Do you believe that you are sinsick?
- 3. What can you learn from Jesus sitting among Levi and his friends?

4. Why would Jesus be willing to sit with you?

Thinking Further:

- 5. Do you sometimes think you are not as bad as others? How does that make you act towards other children?
- 6. Why will working hard to make yourself better never work? What then must we do to become a new person?
- 7. What will you ask Jesus to be like Him: gracious, loving, humble, and kind?
- 8. Jesus was willing to sit with Levi's friends though most Jews hated them. I am sure there are children around you not so well liked. What will you do with them this week?
