**SINGING:** 395:1-4-14:1, 4, 5, 10-137:1-3, 6-451:1, 6

**Reflection**: What have you done with Jesus' precise and devastating report?

A. Are you walking away without a stirring?

- B. Are you convicted as you sense the truth of each line of Jesus' report?
  - 1. Convictions of sin and guilt are good but not for a pillow
  - 2. Many common responses make the case worse: examine if any are yours!
- C. Jesus commands one response: Repentance toward God and faith toward our Lord Jesus Christ (Mark 1:15; Acts 17:30b; 20:21)

### YOU ARE COMMANDED TO REPENT UPON HEARING THE TRUTH

## I. Who is commanding us to repent?

- A. Setting of this command: Paul's sermon to a heathen audience
  - 1. He preached as a godly man filled with holy anger (Acts 17:16; Deut. 9:18)
  - 2. He preached much like we heard: truths from Genesis 1-2 in Acts 17:24-29
    - a. He claimed that the evidence of God is everywhere
      - in His creation and providence: 24-26
      - in their conscience: 27-28
    - b. He claimed their religion was worthless: vs. 29-31
- B. God is commanding you all to repent (30b)
  - 1. What is a *command* of God?
    - a. what does it *not* say?
    - b. what does it say?
  - 2. What do you do with this command?
- C. Who is He Who commands this?
  - 1. Him Who has been incredibly patient over our ignorance (vs. 30a)
  - 2. Him Who has appointed the day for your judgment (vs. 31)

# **II. WHAT IS HIS COMMAND?**

- A. His command cannot be delayed
- B. His command knows of no exemption
- C. His command demands repentance: what is that?
  - 1. Begins with a fundamental change of your thinking
    - Jer. 24:7 And I will give them a <u>heart to know</u> me, that I am the LORD: and they shall be my people, and I will be their God: for they <u>shall return unto me</u> with <u>their whole heart</u>. (Joel 2:12)
  - 2. This change of thinking flows into emotions, will and actions: Examine!
- D. God commands now all men everywhere to repent
  - 1. There is a pressing reason for this repentance today: Job 34:10-11
  - 2. Begin to search yourself for we are not certain the next hour: Ps. 90:12
  - 3. Name and shame your sins God as you learn to see them: Jer 3:13; Ps. 32:5
  - 4. Do not think 'saying sorry' is the same as 'being sorry': Ps. 51:16-17

### CONSIDER ...

- A. God's grace is to encourage you to repent today: Joel 2:12-13
- B. God's promise is that whosoever **believes** shall be saved (today): John 5:24

### FOLLOW UP THOUGHTS ...

Please, take time to ponder and pray about the following truths

- 1. Though after this life repentance is perpetual, it is in vain. (Augustine)
- 2. He who beats his heart, but does not mend his ways, does not remove his sins but hardens them. (Augustine)
- 3. Sin may be the occasion of great sorrow when there is no sorrow for sin. (John Owen)
- 4. Repentance is not a feeling or a longing. It is an action.
- 5. Our repentance needs to be repented of, and our tears washed in the blood of Christ. (George Whitefield)
