THE UNSEARCHABLENESS OF GOD

We hear much about the Gospel of God, but very little of the God of the Gospel. (W. Reed)

A. God's unsearchable glory is hinted at in Exodus 24:10; Ezekiel 1:26-281. This description matches many other passages (Ps. 145:3)

- a. Ex. 33:20, 23: Thou canst not see my face: for there shall no man see me and live ... thou shalt see my back parts: but my face shall not be seen.
- b. 1 Tim. 6:16: Who only hath immortality, dwelling in the light which no man can approach unto; whom no man hath see, nor can see.
- B. God's incomprehensibility is stated in opening verse of Bible a. Gen. 1:1: In the beginning, God ... (John 1:1)
 - God existed as a solitary Being
 - God is not dependent upon His creation (Acts 17:23-28)
 - God is never on our level: Gen. 18:27, ls. 6:1-3; 66:1-2
- C. God's incomprehensibility is revealed in 3 Biblical words 1. Ps. 145:3: He is *unsearchable* (Job 11:7-8; Rom. 11:33-36)
 - 2. 1 Tim. 6:15-16: *invisible unapproachable*
 - 3. Is. 9:6: wonderful (Judges 13:18)
- D. Our inability to comprehend God should not dampen our worship of Him 1. Meditate on the *incomprehensible* readiness to pardon us
 - Ps. 86:5: For thou, Lord, art good, and ready to forgive; and plenteous in mercy unto all that call upon thee. (Is. 55:7-9; 1 Cor. 2:10-12
 - Eph. 3:8 ... the unsearchable riches of Christ!

- 2. Meditate on the incomprehensibleness of His providence: *Thy way is in the sea, and thy path in the great waters, and thy footsteps are not known. (Ps. 77:19)*
 - Rom. 8:28 and we know **that** (not how!) all things work together for good (Rom. 11:33-37)
- 3. Meditate on the unfathomable fruits of His works in His people
 - Phil. 4:7: peace of God that passeth all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus (Phil. 4:12-13)
- E. Not being able to comprehend God is not fruit of our *fallenness* but fruit of our humanness: *For we are but of yesterday, and know nothing, because our days upon earth are as a shadow.* (Job 8:9)

Four applications ...

- A. Be not embarrassed to admit that *God is incomprehensible*
 - 1. Many saints of old admitted this openly: Job 5:8-9; 11:7; 37:5; Ps. 18:11; 97:2; Eccl. 3:11; Is. 40:28
- B. Be not or become not an atheist because God is incomprehensible (Ps. 36:1; Is. 40:12-26)
- C. In Jesus God declared Himself as much as we need to know Him now
 1. Moses only saw God's back parts (Ex. 33:23) but in Jesus we see God's face and heart declared (John 1:18)
- D. Live in anticipation of the future glory of knowing God more/more 1. Eph. 2:4-7 ... that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us through Christ Jesus
