### The Profit of Christ's Ascension (3)

I. He ascended to give to us II. He ascended to labor for us III. He ascended to receive us

## I. He ascended to give to us

A. He poured out the Spirit Who is the 'earnest' in all believers (Eph. 1:14)1. Why did start with this point: *to identify whether we belong to Him* 

and may be comforted with His ascension glory

2. It is our duty to *examine ourselves* (2 Cor. 13:5)

# II. He ascended to labor for us

- A. Picture Jesus' disciples in John 13-17 (14:1; 27b; 16:1b; 16:6)1. Why distressed?
  - 2. Why did Jesus tell them not to be troubled? (John 16:7)
- B. Texts read from Hebrews answer clearly why Jesus' ascension is profit 1. The advantage of Jesus' ascension is similar as incarnation
  - 2. Hebrews majors on 'annual OT Day of Atonement'
- C. What is Christ's work in the heavens for His Church? 1. Heb 1:3: *He reigns as King over all the creation* (Matt. 28:20)
  - 2. Heb. 4:14-16: *He serves as High Priest at right hand of God* a. He is there *exclusively* on our behalf (John 17:9)
    - b. He is there emphatically with us in our daily needs

c. He is there welcoming us day and night (7:24-26)

- 3. 1 John 2:1-2: *He acts as the heavenly advocate* a. He is working in this position *on behalf of all His children* 
  - falling into sin as believer does not sever relationship
    - but sin stresses and strains our relationship with Father
  - b. what does Jesus do as He observes us stumble wander?
  - c. John has no narrow view of His office in vs. 2: *He is the living mercy seat where entire world is welcome* (vs. 3)

### III. He has ascended into heaven to receive us

- A. Let all believers in Jesus often tarry in John 14-17!
  1. John 14:1-3: *He is preparing a place for us in Father's House*a. He is already where He will one day bring us
  - b. How is He 'preparing a place for us?'
  - c. When He returns, it is not to bring us to a 'certain place'
- B. What comforting implications must we draw from this!
  - 1. One day we will see Him face to face as disciples saw Him on Mt. of Transfiguration *without fear* (Matt. 17:1-7; Rev. 1:17a; 1 John 3:2)
  - 2. One day we will be like Him in a perfect world: Rev. 21:1-5
