- A. One of the benefits of being delivered from misery is to be a new man
 - 1. A Christian is a person who is *converting*: Prov. 4:18
 - a. this is part of our deliverance (Acts 9:31)
 - b. call to conversion is no negative command (Acts 3:19; Col. 3)
 - 2. A holy Christian has a 'lifestyle' that leads to happiness (John 13:17)

The identify of New Creature

I. Rooted in Christ II. Fruiting through Christ

<u>The context of our text</u>: Paul's confidence about salvation constraining him 2. He knows and is assured where he is going (vs. 1.8)

- a. He knows and is assured where he is going (vs. 1-8)
- 2. Yet he is not slack about how he lives (vs. 9-16)
 - a. He labors with the view of throne of Jesus in mind (9-10)
 - b. He knows the 'terror of God' as Judge of living/dead (10-11)
 - c. He is constrained by love of Christ (14-16)

I. The identify of New Creature: rooted in Christ

- A. One is only a new creature by being rooted in Christ (17a)
 - 1. To be in Christ is the *key source provision* for living the new life a. apart from abiding in Christ, we cannot bear fruit (John 15:1-4)
 - b. if we do not live by faith in His finished work, we will fail to live holy

II. The identify of the New Creature: fruiting through Christ

A. What is the evidence that you are in Christ for real? 1st heart change: old things are passed away & all things becomes new 2nd **life change:** *repentance from sin* & *conversion to God* (Acts 3:19)

- C. These evidences are the soundest test between a true and false conversion
 - 1. Avoid comparing yourself to other people's experiences/stories
 - a. our hearts are utterly deceitful (Matt 7:21-23; Titus 3:3)

b. Jesus' warning is never old-fashioned: Matt. 5:20 – 1 Cor. 13:1-3

- 2. Instead examine against **Scriptural marks of** *new life* : 2 Cor. 5:17 a. if these are present (always in an imperfect state), rejoice!
 - Phil. 1:6; Col. 1:12-13; 1 Peter 1:13
