JESUS TESTING A BELIEVING SEEKER

I. His strange actions II. His good purpose

I. Jesus testing a seeker by His strange actions

- A. The mother's case is extremely hard: a daughter filled with a devil (vs. 22)
 - 1. Her daughter's condition is the picture of our need
- B. She came to Jesus because she believed what she heard about Him
 - 1. To believe that Jesus is able and willing to help you is *good* but not *saving!*
- C. She met a different Jesus then she might have expected: 23-26
 - 1. His no-reaction is so different (23): see Matt. 8:2-3; 6-7; 13:25-27; 31-39
 - 2. His answer to the disciples' request is worse than no answer (24)
 - 3 His answer on her humble plea at His feet must end all her hope (26)
- D. Her final response to Jesus' words (27)
 - 1. She did not *object* that she had no rights
 - 2. She did confess Him as Lord
 - 3. She did up in her humble plea

II. JESUS' PURPOSES IN TESTING THE SEEKING SINNER

- A. Why did Jesus put this mother through this test?
 - 1. to teach His disciples how not to be a pastor friend (Matt. 15:14)
 - 2. to strengthen, deepen and purify this mother's faith in Him (vs. 28) a. what was her great faith?

- 3. to instruct you are seeking Jesus
 - a. count on an uphill battle when you get serious about seeking Jesus
 - who will oppose you?
 - what if Jesus treats you like her?
- B. What do we take along from this teaching of Jesus and the woman?
 - 1. Trust His promises even though His actions or answers seem no match a. Ps. 119:81: *My soul fainteth for thy salvation: but I hope in Thy Word*
 - 2. Do not get sidetracked about 'Am I elect?' (vs. 24)
 - 3. Let not your sense of unworthiness keep you from His feet
