THE SIN OF ALL SINS

I. Illustrated in Joseph's brothers II. Exposited in Jesus' sermon

I. THE SIN OF ALL SINS AS ILLUSTRATED IN JOSEPH'S BROTHERS

- A. What a dastard deed done to Joseph by his brothers: 18-30
 - 1. The aspects of their sins are clearly spelled out
 - a. vs. 18: consciously
 - b. vs. 19-20: mocking
 - c. vs. 21-22: despite warning
 - d. vs. 23-24: callously
 - e. 25-27:selfishly: 25-27
 - f. vs. 31-35: hypocritically
- B. Though all our sins are sin, not all ours sin are equally evil
 - 1. Sins against light & love stand out: Gen. 42:21; Luke 12:47-48
- C. How could these men come to this? Would we be capable of doing this?
 - 1. James 1:14-15 describes the 'genesis' of this deed (compare Gen. 4)
- D. Yet what we see in Joseph's brethren is illustrative of a worse sin!
 - 1. The sin against the Gospel are worse than those against the Law
 - a. God the Father sent His Son on His mission of peace
 - b. Jesus as the Father's Servant pleads with us to repent & believe

II. THE SIN OF ALL SINS EXPOSITED IN JESUS' OWN SERMON

- A. Jesus' sermon in His home-base is very confronting: Matt. 11:7-24
 - 1. He first likens His hearers to indecisive children: 16-17
 - 2. Then He likens His hearers to worst sinners in world: 21-24
 - a. imagine the privilege to have Jesus living among you
 - b. Jesus's ministry among them was a sovereign privilege
 - c. He needed to rebuke them about their response compared to what Sidon, Tyrus and Sodom would have done: vs. 20
- B. With this teaching Jesus makes clear what sins are blackest to God
 - 1. To Jesus there is something far worse than sins of the worst world
 - 2. Jesus' prediction about the outcome of God's judgment

Two Applications:

- A. Where did Jesus rank you today?
- B. Doubt not that Jesus is still on mercy ground
