- A. Scripture records how God's children struggled to believe the joy of Easter
 - 1. Some had skeptical thoughts: Luke 24:11
 - 2. Some had sad thoughts: Luke 24:11
 - 3. Some had fearful thoughts: Luke 24:37-38
 - 4. Some had doubtful thoughts: Luke 24:41
- B. How did Jesus deal with all these different heart-conditions?

Jesus' Soul-Care to Suffering Disciples

I. Sought out His distressed sheep II. Corrected His erring sheep III. Fed His hungry sheep

I. The 'Risen Savior's Soul-Care: He listened to His distressed sheep

- A. The Shepherd Lord at work in ministering: Luke 24:15
 - 1. His one-sided ministry is key to the Gospel
 - 2. His distressed disciples teetered on edge of despair (vs. 21)a. they loved Jesus as a prophet (vs. 19)

b. they trusted Jesus as promised Redeemer (vs. 21)

c. they decided not to believe the 'idle tales' (vs. 22-24)

- B. How did and does Jesus seek out His distressed sheep?
 - 1. He invites you to share He asks questions (vs. 15-17; Gen. 3:9, 11; 4:6-7)
 - 2. He listened patiently till their whole story was done (vs. 19-24; Is. 11:2-4)
- C. Today Jesus also does His soul-care work through His people1. This work not limited to pastors: Rom. 15:14; 1 Thess 5:14; James 5:19-20

II. The second part of Jesus' soul care: Correcting His erring sheep

A. Jesus begins with speaking the truth in love: vs. 25-26; Eph. 4:15

- B. Jesus' correction begins with a call to repent from their own 'wisdom'
 - 1. Our 'mind' is the biggest problem
 - a. before 'new birth' we are totally blind: Eph. 4:17-23; 1 Cor. 2:14
 - b. after 'new birth' we begin to be renewed in our mind: Eph. 4:15-16, 23
- C. Jesus' next correction is taking straight to Scripture: vs. 26-27, 44

III. The third part of Jesus' soul care: fed His hungry sheep with the Gospel

A. Main theme: the Messiah only would be crowned after suffering (26)

- 1. He could not deliver you as a wonder-doing-prophet only
- 2. He could only be your Savior by paying your penalty of death for sin
- B. Fruit of Jesus' remarkable ministry
 - 1. OT Scripture came to live while their hearts were burning
 - a. new understanding (enlightening) of Scripture and Jesus: 32b
 - b. deeper love for Jesus and His ministry: 32a
 - c. greater hunger to know Jesus: 28-29
 - d. new energy to witness about Jesus: 33-35

Reflect: How blessed you are if God's Spirit has kindled this 'burning desire'!
