## The Epistle to the Romans (4)

Paul continued to develop support for his basic teaching of vs. 16-17 that justification is only by faith

- a. First he proved that the Gentiles are utterly sinful: without personal righteousness: 1:18-32
- b. The he showed that Jews are in the same condition: without personal righteousness: 21-29
- c. Sums up the impossibility to be saved on account of who we are or what we do: 3:10-20
- 1. The verse begins with 'for' implying a connection with verses 16-17. What is the connection?
- 2. We tend to think about God's judgment in the future. But Paul spoke about them in the 'present tense.' So how is God's wrath revealed today?
- 3. According to vs. 18, *why* do people act ungodly and unrighteous? How is this fact reinforced in the following verses?
- 4. According to vs. 19, how do all men know about God?
- 5. Why are men without excuse and what was Paul's intent with that conclusion?
- 6. What can we see of God's glory when reading the book of nature? Does a person need 'saving grace' to read this book well enough to be convinced that God is real and great?
- 7. "The poor and ignorant heathens don't know any better when they bow before sticks and stones." How would Paul have responded to that?
- 8. How does Jeremiah 2:5 support vs. 22-23?
- 9. What is the connection with *idolatry* (vs. 23) and *immorality* (vs. 24-25)?
- 10. If we look at our culture through the lens of vs. 26-32, what conclusion must we draw?
- 11. Looking at the details is good, but at times we lose sight of the big picture. So, what is main point Paul has made in vs. 18-31 regarding *how can I be saved or just with God*?
