PAUL'S GOSPEL

I. Needs to be declared by preaching II. Needs to be received by faith III. Needs to be kept in memory IV. Needs to be passed on to others

I. Paul's Gospel needs to be declared by preaching

- A. What is the Gospel Paul refers to?
 - 1. He defined it as story of Jesus Christ: vs. 3-4ff
 - a. this 'story of redemption' is the heart and center of Scriptures
 - 2. The 12 articles sum up the *essential content of Gospel taught by apostles*
 - a. Apostle's Creed is not written by the 12 apostles
 - b. The 3 Creeds capture the truths foundational to salvation (Col. 1:23)
 - implies that not everything in Bible is foundational to salvation
- B. This Gospel needs to be declared by **preaching** (2 Tim. 4:2)
 - 1. I am sent to you by Lord Jesus to make known glad tidings of Gospel
 - a. it is the tidings of the Triune God at work to make salvation reality
- C. This Gospel needs to be repeatedly preached (vs, 1, 3)
 - 1. because Gospel is like unsearchable riches of Christ (Eph. 3:8)
 - 2. because Gospel is God's power to save (Rom. 1:16; 1 Cor. 1:18ff)
 - a. we witness fulfilment of 2 Tim. 3:1 4:3-4 (Ps. 11:2-3)
 - b. against these assaults against foundations, the glorious Gospel of the blessed God will be *victorious* (1 Cor. 15:57-58)
 - 3. because Gospel preached leads to assurance of faith (Luke 24:27, 44-45)

II. Paul's Gospel is to be received by us through faith

- A. God's Gospel not a 'news bulletin'
 - 1. It is **proclamation** with a call to obey, invitation come, promises to believe

2. To receive/stand on Jesus's Gospel implies a rejection of devil's lies

III. The Gospel is to be kept in memory to be saved in truth

- A. Paul pleads w/ Corinthians not to let go teaching he delivered to them (1, 3)
 - 1. These early Christians faced the heresy denying resurrection of Jesus
 - 2. What happens to 'our faith' when we deny the *fundamental doctrines?* a. our faith, hope, comforts are vain (1 Cor. 15: 13, 14, 17)
- B. Therefore we need to keep in memory, which is "to hold fast" (believe)
- C. Paul asserted that we are saved only if we keep it in memory
 - 1. It does not mean that my salvation is 'conditioned' on my faith
 - 2. Yet it confirms the link between faith and saved

IV. The Gospel is to be delivered by us to others (vs. 3-4)

- A. Paul 'received Gospel from God'
 - 1. Gospel of Jesus is passed on to us and needs to be passed on by us
 - 2. The **essentials** of the Gospel are summarized in confessional standards

Brief summaries of Christian doctrine are of great use to young beginners. The principles of the Word of God are brought into a little compass in the creeds and catechisms. They are like the beams of the sun contracted in a sunglass. Through this they convey the divine light and heat with a wonderful power.

Closing plea: Value, study and live the doctrines of Holy Scripture!

A. The doctrines of the Gospel are as essential as the duties of the Gospel Deut. 32:2

My doctrine shall drop as the rain, my speech shall distil as the dew, as the small rain upon the tender herb, and as the showers upon the grass. Romans 6:17

But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you.

B. Resist the arrogancy of *choosing what you like and rejecting what you dislike* the truths in the Gospel (Augustine)
