I. MEANING OF THE UNION OF THE VINE AND BRANCHES

- A. Before the Vine comes the Husbandman (vs. 1)
 - 1. God the Father provided His Son as the Vine (2 Cor. 1:3; Eph. 1:3; Is. 42:1)
 - 2. The heavenly Husbandman's purpose in the Vine: much fruit (vs. 8)
 - a. He applies His 'vine-dresser' skills to produce more fruit (vs. 2-3, 6)
 - b. The fruit He seeks: Rom. 8:29; Eph. 1:4; 1 Thess. 4:3a
- B. Jesus is the *I AM* the *True Vine*
 - 1. Picture His deep roots strong trunk copious branches
 - a. The Vine is secret of the fruit of holiness
 - b. holy living is defined as
 - a moral life yet far more than that
 - a separated life as well as a consecrated life
 - 2. Jesus emphasizes the *key to the Christian's abundant fruitfulness* a. to abide in Him (vs. 4-9)
 - b. to do nothing apart from Him (vs. 4-5)
- C. What is Jesus' message for us?
 - 1. If you are *unsaved sinner*, you need to come to Jesus X
 - a. We have all become a *dead branch* in Adam (1 Cor. 15:22)
 - b. Only hope for real change: to become a branch in the Living Vine
 - by the work of God (Ezek. 16:6; Eph. 2:1-10)
 - by faith in Jesus Christ (John 1:12; Acts 16:31; Heb. 10:39)
 - 2. If you are believing follower, you need to abide in Christ for more fruit
 - a. What is 'more fruit' look like in Jesus' own life?
 - b. How can we be like Him in this holiness?
 - by abiding in Him through relying upon Him (vs. 4)

- by abiding in Him through His word abiding in you (vs. 7a)
- by abiding in Him through prayer (vs. 7b)
- c. All this will be enriched deeply when we grasp the rich implications of our union with Him (for next week, DV)
