- 1. Words are amazingly powerful (Prov. 10:11; 11:9; 12:18 16:28)
- 2. Therefore God established a clear boundary around the use of words a. Eph. 4:15, 25, 26, 29

I. THE TRUTH ABOUT OUR 'WORDS'

- A. "Words" happen all day and they can be dangerous or lethal: James 3:6
- B. "Words" are powerful: Prov. 15:4
 - 1. They can be hugely damaging for the 'remainder of one's life'
 - 2. They can also be cleansing and healing: Eph. 5:25-26; Prov. 10:11
- C. 'All words' are important: Matt. 12:36-37
 - 1. God is listening and recording to how we use His gift of 'talking' words
- D. Why are words so important to God?
 - 1. The 'theology' of words: Gen. 1:26
 - 2. The first speech in the universe: Gen. 1:3 (Eph. 4:29; Prov. 10:11)
 - 3. All talk among humans began with God talking to us: Gen. 1:28
- E. What can we learn from God's use of words?
 - 1. He did use His Word as vehicles to bring blessings
 - 2. He did use words to make connections or relationships
 - a. without words we remain ignorant of others: 1 Cor. 2:11-13; John 1:14
 - b. God's words (Word) were to reveal (John 1:18)
 - c. He used words about Himself we can understand and relate to

Concluding applications:

- A. Image bearing of God includes the *use of words*: Gen. 1:26; 9th commandment
 - 1. Among all creation, man is the only one able to communicate our inner being
 - 2. God's use of words is to guide us in how we use our words a. see the depth of the fall in Gen. 3's use of words
- B. 1 Cor. 10:31 includes the use of our tongue (James 3:9-10)
 - 1. Does this govern every conversation, both orally and digitally?
 - 2. What are 'idle words' Jesus refers to in Matthew 12:36-37?
- C. Look unto Jesus in 1 Peter 2:22-24a:

Who did no sin, neither was guile found in His mouth;

Who, when He was reviled, reviled not again;

When He suffered, He threatened not, but committed himself to Him that judgeth righteously;

Who His own self bare our sins in His own body on the tree ...
