Intro: Our Christian faith is not only a religion of mystery but also experience

- A. Don't be afraid of word 'experience'
 - 1. Art 9 appeals to experience as confirmation of Trinity
 - 2. Experiential Christianity is a powerful confirmation of its reality
- B. Scriptural teaching on Trinity is three main truths
 - 1. God is three Persons: John 1:1-2 John 14:26 Rom. 8:27
 - 2. God is one God: Deut. 6:4-5; Is. 45:5-6; 45:21-22; 1 Tim. 2:5; James 2:19
 - 3. Each Person is fully God: John 5:26; John 1:1; Acts 5:3, 4 (art. 10, 11)

The Experience of the operations of the Triune God in the life of a Believer I. Who is the believer? II. What are the experiential operations of Triune God?

I. Who is the believer?

- A. The believer is a person described in Ephesians 1:13-14
 - 1. They trust in Lord Jesus Christ
 - a. saving faith is always found in a context of spiritual exercises
 - b. the 'saving' of their faith is the object they trust: Jesus Christ
 - 2. They are sealed with the Holy Spirit of promises
 - a. this seal is the earnest of the inheritance
 - b. this seal indicates authenticity and ownership
 - c. this seal is Holy Spirit's indwelling
- B. The believer is not always clear about salvation: Eph. 1:17ff
- II. The operations of the Persons of the Trinity in Salvation
- A. God the Father is cause , origin, and beginning of all things visible/invisible
 - 1. He is the cause of all life: John 5:26 Ps. 2:7 Eph. 4:6 Col. 1:16
 - 2. He is also the cause of your spiritual life: Eph. 2:4; 1:4-6
 - a. He chose sovereignly to adopt fallen sinners (Eph. 1:4-5)

- b. adoption is highest privilege that the Gospel announces
- 3. The Father's drawing operation (John 6:44-45) becomes known through the activity of the Spirit: Gal. 4:6-7
- B. God the Son is *our Savior and Redeemer by His life and death for us*: Eph. 1:6-8
 - 1. He assumed our flesh and came upon this world as our Mediator: John 1:14
 - 2. Experientially we discover the need for Another
 - a. as we see how deeply unacceptable and guilty we are before God
 - b. God the Father provided in His Son the Savior we need: Gal. 4:4-5
 - 3. We placed our faith in Him as the righteousness of God: Eph. 1:12-13a
- C. God the Spirit is our Sanctifier by His dwelling in our hearts
 - 1. The starting point of His sanctifying work is regeneration (John 3:8)
 - a. though no one will comprehend fully His work
 - b. we experience the power of His presence in leading us (Rom 8:14)
 - He leads our hearts to turn, to repent, to believe, and follow
 - c. Paul prayed that the Ephesians would *understand* how they came actually to faith in Jesus Christ: Eph. 1:18-20; 2:4-8
 - 2. The petitions of the believers reveal their exercises with the Holy Spirit
 - a. in the daily battle experienced
 - b. in the ongoing prayers offered
 - c. in the petition for His reassuring witness
