- A. The setting of this ministry of pastoral care
 - 1. Truth about you is not seen on sunny days (Acts 7:59-60; 16:20-25)
 - 2. Peter *inspired* direction is to see Jesus as example (1 Peter 2:21-25)
- B. John's recollection of Jesus 3rd cross word: vs. 26-27
 - 1. He was part of a group of faithful disciples
 - 2. Jesus saw deeply into their hearts: Hebrews 13:8; 4:14-16
- C. Jesus addressed & cared for his mother
 - 1. Mary's journey with Jesus was the journey of a sword piercing her heart
 - 2. Jesus' addressed her need for a new relationship with Him
