I. THE SINNER'S THIRST

- A. All men are thirsty since our rebellion against God
 - 1. What do we thirst for as we live in the 'land of Nod' (Gen. 4:16)?
- B. What are you doing to *quench your thirst?*
 - 1. All variety of efforts are summed up by God in Jeremiah 2:5, 13
- C. Jesus analyzed this attempt to quench your thirst in John 4:13 (Luke 16:24)
 - 1. His cure is one: John 4:14; 6:27; 7:37-38

II. THE SAINT'S THIRST

- A. God's saints are & remain thirsty people: reason and object are different
- B. Examine this thirst
 - 1. Ps. 130 (Ps. 32:3-4; 38:1-2, 9-10)
 - 2. Ps. 27:4
 - 3. Ps. 42:1-2-63:1-3
 - 4. Rom. 7:24
- C. If such soul-thirst is *not strange to you*, then be good of cheer (Ps. 36:8-9)

III. THE SAVIOR'S THIRST

- A. Consider His soul-thirst
 - 1. For hours our Lord has battled Satan and his demons
 - 2. For hours our Lord has been drinking His Father's hot-displeasure over sin!
- B. What caused His thirst
 - 1. His love and zeal for God (Ps. 40:7-8; Luke 20:50; John 14:31)
 - 2. His love and zeal for His people's salvation (John 15:13; Romans 5:6-10)
- C. Behold and hear Him: I thirst!
 - 1. Only one thing would quench His thirst: Ps. 63:3; Ps. 4:6-7
