Jesus Sanctified Himself (2)

I. In what way did He do this II. To what end did He do this

II. To what end did He did this

A. He did it to *please His Father & glorify Him* (Ps. 40; John 12:28; 17:1)

B. He did it to sanctify His people (17, 19b 20-26)

1. This is Christ's ultimate *fruit* of all His labors for His Church: Eph. 1:4; 5:25; 1Thess. 4:7; 1 Peter 2:24; 1 John 1:6, 9

a. His cross took away the *impediment to enter glory*

b. His sanctifying work takes away the impediment to enjoy glory

2. This is only reason why believers in Jesus are already 'saints'

C. He did it to *bring spiritual unity* to the body of His Church (20-24) 1. The spiritual unity: *that they all may be one as He/Father are*

a. this unity is of the highest order

b. yet this unity is not invisible: 21b, 23b

- 2. Spiritual unity of believers in Christ turns the Church into a powerhouse
- D. He did it *to make His people partakers with Him in His glory*: 22-24
 1. Jesus has given His people His own glory already (22a)

- 2. Yet Jesus prays on 'merit's ground' (I will!) for full participation in His glory a. meditate upon the exploding crescendo of our ultimate destiny: 22-26
 - to be one even as the Father and Son are (21, 22b)
 - to be perfect in one (23b)
 - to be with Him where He is (24a)
 - to behold His glory in glory (24b)
 - to share in love wherewith His Father loved the Son (26)
- 3. Jesus is never at rest until He has all His Church with Him in glory (24) a. What will they do in glory?
 - to behold His glory in an eternal unfolding of the Father's infinite love wherewith He loved His Son (vs. 26)

Some closing reflections:

A. Eternity will be a continuation of the feasting on the glory of God

- 1. Jesus Himself will continue what He began in John 1:18, 17:26
- B. If God is so glorious, why do men not love Him? (2 Cor. 4:4)

C. Yet God is so glorious that He offers us His services and medicine: Rv. 3:18, 20
