I. Jesus' Audience

- A. Who was (and is) Jesus' preaching to?
- B. "If any man thirst ..."
 - 1. What are we all thirsty for?
 - 2. Where does every man's thirst come from?
 - 3. Is there a thirst that goes deeper than what we all thirst for?

II. Jesus' Directions in His sermon

- A. His first direction: to come to Him instead of anyone/thing else
 - 1. Listen to His questions in Is. 55:2; Jer. 2:11-13
 - 2. Come to Me: what is that and how do we do this?
 - a. what do we in 'daily life' when we need help or wisdom?
 - b. so Jesus tells us to turn to Him for everything: Why?
 - Because He is able and only able to save us to the uttermost
 - c. when He calls us to come, He calls us to trust Him for soul and body
- B His second direction: and drink
 - 1. Realize the importance of 'drinking for a thirsty soul'
 - a. What good is 'to come and not to drink' Him?

b. What does He call us to drink?

III. His amazing promise

- A. How brilliant is Jesus' picture of rivers of living waters
 - 1. See contrast with Genesis 6:5: we are a fountain of iniquity
 - 2. Jesus' promise upon coming and trusting Him is a *new heart*: Acts 2:38-47 a. Nothing is more beautiful that a *new heart and a new spirit within*
 - new heart is the fruit of coming to and drinking of Jesus' truths
 - new heart is heart full of the fruit of Spirit (Gal. 5:16-23)

Close: Will you come and drink and become as a river of water?
